





Jane's Malt Loaf.

13ozs sultanas,
2ozs margarine,
12 fluid ozs hot water,
13ozs self raising flour,
9ozs soft brown sugar,
1/2 teasp bicarb,
2 eggs,
Chopped nuts optional.

Warm sultanas, marg and hot water in a pan. Bring to boil and simmer for 4 minutes. Allow to cool a little. Sieve flour and bicarb together. Mix in sugar. Add warm fruit and beaten eggs and nuts if liked. Grease 2 1lb loaf tins. Divide mixture between them and bake @190/gas mark 5 for 1 hour. If using 1 2lb tin bake at same temp for 1 1/2 hrs approx. Enjoy.
